

ENHANCING INSTITUTIONAL CAPACITY AND KNOWLEDGE MANAGEMENT

The Corporation continues to strengthen internal capacity through targeted training and knowledge-sharing initiatives. A two-day capacity-building programme for Knowledge Management Champions equipped staff with practical skills in knowledge mapping, storytelling, mentorship, and knowledge retention. Additionally, internal audit sensitisation sessions reinforced the role of audit as a tool for improving organisational processes, accountability, and performance. These initiatives are key to building a responsive and efficient institution capable of delivering sustainable impact.

POWERING RARIEDA: ELECTRIFICATION EXPANDS OPPORTUNITY IN SIAYA COUNTY

A major milestone was achieved in Kisii County with the commissioning of the Igego and Bokebo Villages Rural Electrification Project in Nyaribari Chache Constituency. The project has connected 97 households and key public facilities, including schools, dispensaries, and trading centres, to reliable electricity. Beyond technical delivery, the project is already driving tangible impact—supporting digital learning in schools, enabling healthcare services such as vaccine storage, and creating new opportunities for local businesses. commissioning underscored the transformative role of electricity in improving livelihoods and fostering inclusive development.

EXPANDING ACCESS IN WESTERN KENYA: ELECTRIFICATION GAINS MOMENTUM

Efforts to bridge the electricity access gap in Western Kenya continue to gain momentum, with key projects commissioned in Bungoma County and new initiatives rolled out in Trans Nzoia. In Webuye East and Kimilili constituencies, electrification projects are connecting households to the grid, supporting enterprise development and improving quality of life.

In Trans Nzoia County, upcoming projects in Cherengany and Kiminini constituencies are expected to connect over 160 households, following extensive public sensitisation forums. These engagements ensure communities are informed and actively involved in project implementation, reinforcing sustainability and shared ownership of development outcomes.

REREC has intensified electrification efforts in the Coast region, with major projects launched and commissioned in Kilifi County. Projects in Dabaso, Matsangeni, and Kahingoni are set to connect over 300 households, while additional initiatives in Malindi will benefit more than 600 households.

These interventions are part of a broader strategy to expand access to electricity and stimulate economic growth across the region. Improved access to power is expected to enhance business activity, strengthen public services, and elevate living standards for communities along the Coast.

ENHANCING OPERATIONAL EFFICIENCY AT THE COAST

REREC has continued to enhance service delivery through targeted staff training and institutional strengthening initiatives. Sensitisation sessions on the Citizens' Service Charter and complaints handling mechanisms have been conducted across several regions, equipping staff with the tools to deliver efficient, transparent, and accountable services.

These initiatives are aimed at improving responsiveness to customer needs, strengthening governance frameworks, and reinforcing public confidence in the Corporation's operations



REREC has intensified efforts to expand electricity access in informal settlements through the People Settlement Areas (PSA) Electrification Programme. A high-level stakeholder engagement meeting brought together Members of County Assembly, energy sector representatives, and REREC leadership to align on implementation strategies.

The discussions focused on project design, mapping, compliance, and structured community sensitisation for key settlements including Kiambiu, Kibera, Kamukunji, and Korogocho. This coordinated approach aims to ensure safe, sustainable, and inclusive electrification, addressing both infrastructure needs and community dynamics in densely populated urban areas.
